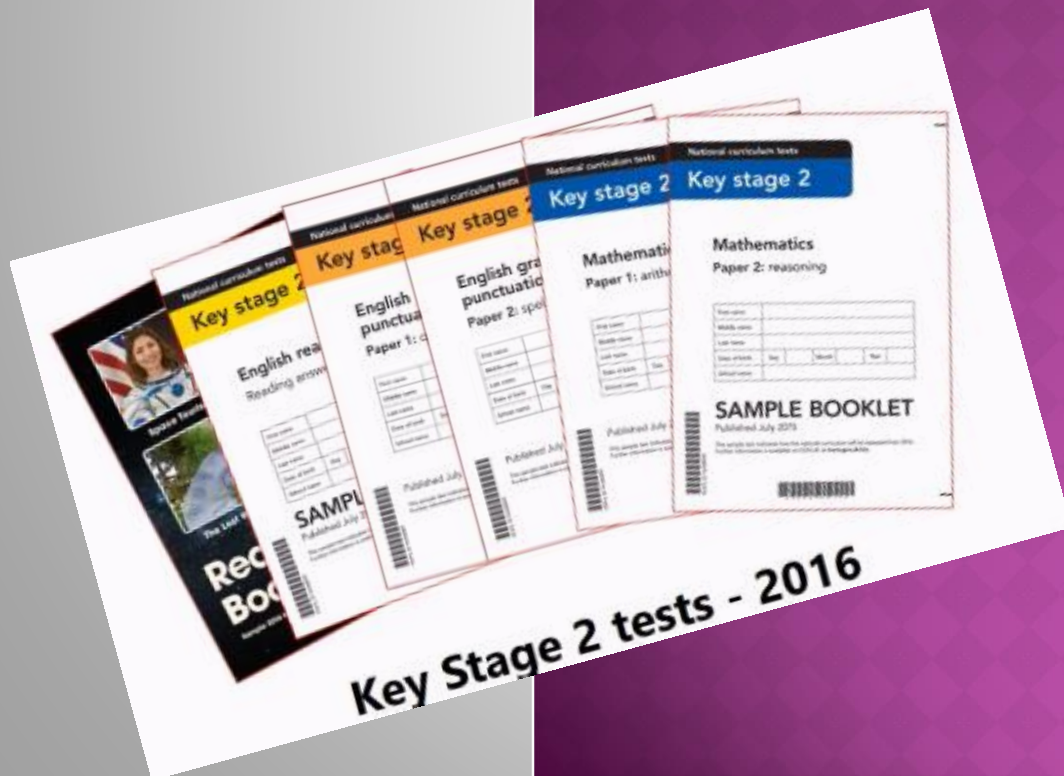

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What are SATs?

- ◉ SATs (Standard Assessment Tests) tests are administered in schools at the end of year 6.
- ◉ They are used to show and measure your child's progress against the National Curriculum.
- ◉ The papers are sent away to be marked with results being available before your child leaves primary school in July.

CHANGES TO BE AWARE OF

- ◉ Levels will no longer be used to report to parents.
- ◉ Results will show whether children will either have 'met' Age related expectations or 'not met.'
- ◉ Papers are now marked electronically - presentation is now key!

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Key Stage 2 tests - 2016

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SATS week

- ◉ SATs week starts on Monday 14th May - 7 months away!
- ◉ No holidays please at all during this time!
- ◉ No holidays before, during term time.
- ◉ Tests cannot be sat at later dates.
- ◉ Illness during the SATs.

Space Tourism

In 1969, a man walked on the Moon for the first time. After this, many people thought that space travel would be available by the year 2000 and that we would all be space tourists. How would you get to your space hotel? In the future there may be hotels in space for all the tourists. It wouldn't take long for the space shuttle to get out of the Earth's atmosphere. 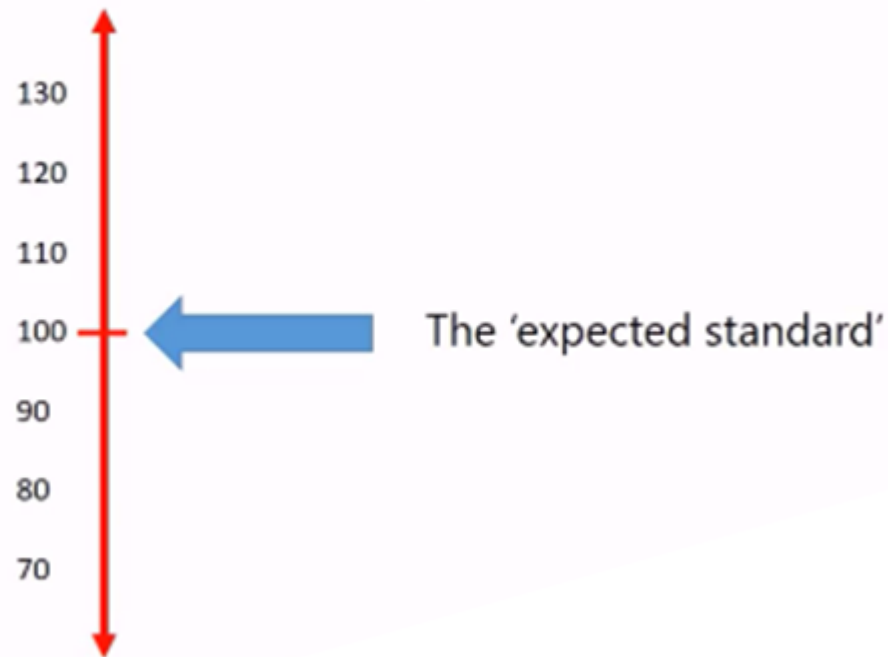

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Preparation in school

- ◉ Literacy and Numeracy lessons are based around the key skills the children will need for their SATs.
- ◉ We continually make teacher assessments of the areas each child needs to develop further.
- ◉ The children will have several mock SATs weeks to get used to the SATs tests. All mock weeks will be held in the classrooms, exactly as we will do in the real SATs week.
- ◉ We use the data from the tests to inform our planning, create booster groups and identify children that may need extra support in lessons.

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Booster Groups

- ⦿ Booster groups will run from now until SATs.
- ⦿ These are small groups of children working at a similar level.
- ⦿ Children will be identified for boosting from teacher assessments of classwork.
- ⦿ Some boosters will happen during the school day, some will be before and after school.
- ⦿ Boosters can make a BIG difference to a child's progress.

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Preparation at home

- Homework given out is to replicate the style of SATS questions and will be useful in preparation.
- Please ensure that homework is completed to the best of your child's ability and handed in.
- Some will be past papers your child has completed at school and brought home for analysis. Working through errors with a parent can be really useful.
- CGP SAT Buster packs are a really useful tool - these will be on sale after Christmas from the school - 3 books for £5!
- All children have access to Mathletics and Times Tables Rockstars which is computer based and can be very helpful.
- You can purchase test style papers from WH Smith, Amazon or from CGP.
- All past papers, for SPAG, Reading and maths, level 3-5 and level 6 are available from satspapers.org.uk

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Preparation at home

- ⦿ Reading - please listen to and read with your child at least three times per week. Please record this in your child's planner along with a comment about their reading.
- ⦿ Practice times tables - these need to be known as facts up to 12×12 .
- ⦿ Use their planner to pass on any concerns/questions to us. We can use this as a home-school dialogue. Or, feel free to pop in to school or call school and we will do our best to make ourselves available.
